Sophomore album, "Tell Tale Heart," recorded in Nashville, Tennessee, under the guidance of Grammy award winner Casey Wasner (Keb' Mo', Taj Mahal), stands as a testament to Avey Grouws Band's musical evolution. Released in 2021, "Tell Tale Heart" stormed onto the scene, debuting at an impressive #7 on the Billboard Blues Album chart. This achievement followed their 2020 debut album, "The Devil May Care," which also made waves on the Billboard charts, peaking at #10 and marking the band as a formidable force in the roots rock landscape.
